- Era: 1950s to 1980s
- Turnouts: No. 4 in S scale, No 3 or 2.5 in O scale

## Design Summary

One of my favorite prototype railroads was the Kaslo and Slocan Division of the Canadian Pacific in British Columbia. I've always wanted to build a layout of the line and even had an HO plan published in Model Railroader in the May 2009 issue. This plan is fairly simple and emphasizes the mainline run with the up and over design. There is only one industry served - a logging camp at the top of the hill. Cars would be brought down to the rail barge. A small engine service track is also included. The scenery in this area is lots of tall pine tree covered hills. This will make transportation difficult so the hills towards the middle of the railroad will need to be made removable. This plan is currently designed to work in S scale and potentially O scale with a very small Plymouth type engine. All the turnouts are curved so the track would have to be handlaid on the railroad.
